Please support your children at home in learning these as in the summer term they will have to sit a national test where the expectation is that they are able to recall these off by heart.

This term we will be learning the stories 'Kassim and The Greedy Dragon' and 'Bobby the Brave Knight'.

Our themes are: Weather Experts

Carnival of the Animals

Maths Literacy/T4W

We teach writing through the Talk for Writing approach, developed by Pie Corbett. Pupils learn a story or text off by heart using pictures and symbols on a story map (or text map if it is nonfiction), and actions. They learn all the writer's skills and create 'toolkits' in order to write their own stories/texts at the end of the unit. This half term. pupils will complete 1 story unit looking at 'Kassim and the Greedy Dragon', and rewriting their own story. They will also complete a non-fiction unit by writing a set of instructions on how 'To catch a dragon' and 1 poetry unit looking at writing an acrostic dragon poem. In addition to this, pupils will play language and sentence games regularly in order to prepare them for the Y2 Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation assessment (SPAG).

The second half term, pupils will complete 1 story unit looking at 'Bobby the brave knight', and re-writing their own story. They will also complete a non-fiction unit by writing nonchronological report on a animal of their choice.

In Maths children will be learning to consolidate their knowledge of place value in 2 and 3 digit numbers. They will be using these knowledge to help them add and subtract two-digit numbers, using partitioning and column addition.

The children will also be learning about multiplication and division and how to use arrays to solve multiplication and division problems. There will also be a heavy focus on learning and recalling the 2s, 5s, and 10s times-tables off by heart.

Children will also be revisiting 2d and 3d shapes, looking at their properties.

Topic

Weather Experts' with a Science and Geography focus.

The children will build on their knowledge of seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK such as:

creating and filming their own weather forecasts.

making their own weather station. They will begin to understand the hot and cold areas of the world as well as developing locational knowledge and early geographical skills.

extreme weather conditions in the UK. I homes adapted to different climates around the world.

create a storm-resistant den or floodresistant house.

Our second topic this term is called 'Carnival of the Animals' with a Music and Science focus. The children will using the 'Carnival of the Animals' orchestra piece to look at pitch and tempo in music. They will be taught to identify and describe a variety of animals and to group them according to the 5 groups of animal

classification.

The children will be looking at different animals in the environment and where they come on the food chain. The children will be looking at a variety of food chains in different habitats and be able to explain what a producer and a consumer is. The children will also be learning about herbivores, omnivores and carnivares and will be able to sort
