Reception Curriculum Overview Spring Term 2

Willow, Silver Birch and Hazel Class

This overview is intended to give you a flavour of what we will be learning this half term.



Physical development

- We will use a variety of interesting resources to strengthen the muscles in our fingers, such as; threading laces, cutting with scissors, pegging and using tweezers. This helps us to develop a good pencil grip when writing.
- It's very important to strengthen our upper body too by pulling and pushing large equipment, throwing, sweeping and drawing large pictures with chalks and paint brushes.
- We will regularly practise name writin.
- Children will have the opportunity to explore the outdoor area daily.
- The opportunity for every child to brush their teeth at school is provided. We talk about others ways we can contribute to a healthy life style.
- The Daily Mile is a big hit and we continue to run everyday on the Junior School field.

Communication and Language

- We will read a range of books and encourage children to join in with familiar text and respond to what they hear.
- We will play listening and attention games to support children to be 'good' listeners.
- Children will gain confidence in speaking and taking turns in conversations.
- Children are listened to by the adult and we support children to answer 'how' and 'why' questions about their experiences.

Personal, Social and Emotional development

- \circ $\,$ We encourage children to be responsible learners and access resources independently.
- Children are taught how to care for the resources and tidy away at the end of a session.
- \circ $\,$ We help children to talk about their feelings.
- Children are supported in forming good relationships with their peers and teachers. They are taught how to negotiate and solve problems by talking.
- We support children in speaking in familiar groups and encourage them to share their ideas.



Everyday we explore the outdoors and enjoy being physically active. Your child needs a spare clothes bag and a named pair of wellie boots in school at all times.

Literacy

- Our Talk for Writing book this term is '*The* Enormous Turnip.' Towards the end of term you will be invited in to your child's class for a story retelling.
- \circ $\,$ We will learn about what vegetables grow below and above the ground.
- The children have access to a wide range of fiction and non-fiction books in the book corner and the environment.
- We celebrate children's favourite stories and talk about the story setting and characters.
- We will play rhyming games and notice rhyming words in books.
- Read Write Inc. happens 4x week We are learning the sounds letters make, how to read words and simple sentence.
- We encourage children to write for a range of purposes, like: labelling, lists, cards, letters and messages.



Please change your child's book every day and update the reading record so we can celebrate the books you share together.



Mathematics

- Every day we count how many children are at school and recite numbers in order to 20.
- We use a variety of resources to develop our mathematical skills such weighing scales, different sized containers, objects that are heavy/light and can be used for measuring.
- We support children in recognising numbers from 1-10/20.
- Children are encouraged to name and describe the properties of 2D (square, circle, rectangle, triangle) and 3D shapes (sphere, cube, cuboid, pyramid)
- We are learning one more and less from a group of up to 10 objects and adding and taking away numbers to 10.
- We use 'Word Aware' to help us learn new words to do with mathematics, i.e. longest, tallest, heaviest.

Understanding of the World

- Children are given lots of opportunity to talk.
 Adults actively listen and respond with interest to what they say.
- Birthdays and other special events like Easter and Shrove Tuesday will be celebrated.
- \circ $\,$ We will observe the changes to the environment, such as the change in season and the weather.
- Children are given the opportunity to understand about growing. We will be weeding our flower beds in preparation for planting vegetables, herbs and flowers.







Expressive Arts and Design

- Every day we sing familiar nursery rhymes and songs.
- Time is provided to listen to music and enjoy dancing and playing musical instruments.
- The creative area is always available to make models and experiment with mixing paints.
- Children are encouraged to use their imagination in their play and make up stories and act out real life situations for example, making theatres and shops.
