PARENTS/CARERS WILL:

- Attend termly Learning Review meetings to discuss pupils' progress. (Reception through to Year 2)

- Support and encourage the child's learning at home by helping with reading every day and other homework as set.
- Send children to school wearing the correct uniform and always bring in their book bag.
- Where possible, celebrate and support their child at school events such as class assembly, sports day and story cafes.

- Attend meetings planned to inform parents/carers about assessment and learning.
- Act as role models for children in and around school.
- Treat all staff and families with respect.
- Read all letters/messages that are sent home.
- Inform the school immediately of any changes to parent/carer and emergency contact details.
