## **School will be closed until further notice**

Dear Families,

### **Re: Coronavirus update – school closure**

Following my last update, **the government has instructed me to close the school at the end of the school day until further notice.**

**Children will need to stay at home, so you will not be able to send your child into school from Monday onwards.** This measure has been put in place to limit social contact and slow the spread of Covid-19.

Please note that this is a **national closure**, so whilst it is a challenging situation, we are not alone. We'll re-open fully as soon as we can and we will let you know when this is, by text, facebook and on our website.

We have contacted the **very few families** at our school, who the government advises may be eligible to attend school if 'absolutely necessary' next week and we will open only to these children on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> March, until the end of the day on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> April 2020.

Even for the children of families who could be eligible to attend school, the government states

'If children can stay safely at home, they should, to limit the chance of the virus spreading'.

## What we will do whilst your child is at home

Your child's learning is very important to us, so we will continue to help your child to learn.

- All school aged children will be given learning packs today if they are in school. For those children absent today, they can be collected from the school office **from Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> March** between 10am – 2pm.
- We will update learning resources and notify you through our website and face book page, so please keep a look out for these.
- We will send home in the learning pack, your teacher's school email address. You can contact them during term time with any queries or advice regarding your child's learning.
