THE SCHOOL WILL:

- Provide a safe and happy environment appropriate for the development of young children.
- Help children to make progress from their different starting points both academically and in their personal, social, emotional development.
- Provide a balanced curriculum following government guidelines and adapting to meet community needs.
- Strive to use best practice in the care and education of your child.
- Show and model respect to everyone and expect it in return.
- Inform families about their children's progress at regular meetings.
- Provide a written annual report for children in Reception through to Year 2.
- Communicate regularly in a variety of formats with families, about schools, news and development.
- Involve families in planning for individual children's needs and their next steps.
- Encourage good behaviour and involve families in decisions about specific behaviour strategies.
- Ensure school is a welcoming community for all.

- Offer opportunities for families to be involved in school life and decision making.

PARENTS/CARERS WILL:

- Ensure their school aged child arrives at school on time, at the published time and is collected on time at the end of the day.
- Make sure that their child attends school every day and will inform the school of any reasons for absence on the day.
- Attend Learning Review meetings to discuss their child's progress. (Reception through to Year 2)
- Talk to school staff if they have any concerns about their child that might affect their child's ability to learn or behave appropriately.
- Actively support the school's Behaviour Policy.
- Support and encourage their child's learning at home, by helping with reading every day and other homework as set.
- Send their school aged child to school wearing the correct uniform and always bring in their bookbag.
- Where possible, celebrate and support their child at school events eg class assembly, sports day and story cafes.

- Attend meetings planned to inform parents/carers about assessment and learning.
- Act as role models for children in and around school.
- Treat all staff and families with respect.
- Read all letters/messages that are sent home.
- Inform the school immediately of any changes to parent/carer and emergency contact details.

CHILDREN WILL:

- Be kind and welcoming.
- Take responsibility for their own actions.
- Be polite to adults and other children.
- Show a growth mind-set, keep trying and never give up.
- Follow instructions from all adults in and around school.
- Keep themselves and others safe.
- Follow school rules and routines.
- Talk to adults at home and at school about any worries.
- Be the best learner they can be.
- Help other children to learn.
