Learning This Half Term

Sadly because of lockdown3, many children have been learning from home this half term. We know that this hasn't been easy and we want to thank all our families for their perseverance and hard work at keeping the learning going and the staff for supporting remote learning via Class Dojo. We are also grateful to Lotus, BT and Vodafone for supplying devices and internet access to families, in need at this time.

Nursery has continued to remain open during this current lockdown. 'Three Little Pigs' has been one of the focus stories and children have also been taking part in the recent RSPB Garden Bird Watch. Children in reception have been learning about people who help us and keeping healthy. The story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' has enabled Year 1 children to learn more about bears and other animal groups and create their own story maps. Mulberry class have learnt about animal habitats with a minibeast hunt and in Year 2, children have worked really hard with their phonics and reading and have enjoyed den building indoors and outside. We have also loved seeing your photos of children playing out in the snow and taking part in the challenges set by their teachers, this week.
