## School/Nursery closes for Easter and what to do if your child displays symptoms

School/nursery closes for Easter, this **Friday 26**<sup>th</sup> **March.** If your child **develops a temperature, persistent new cough, lack of smell or taste** which are recognised covid19 symptoms over the weekend (Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> or Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> March), please notify the school by emailing **covid@weins.co.uk**. The advice from the DFE is that Lateral Flow Tests (LFT) are only used to test for asymptomatic (no symptoms) cases and that **anyone displaying symptoms** must book a **PCR test** online and **self isolate** with those that they live with.

### Keeping children and adults safe

We have talked to the children about **staying close to their adult** when they are coming in and leaving school. There have been several incidents, where children have been running around the playground after being collected and bumping into adults arriving to collect their

own child. Please ensure you **hold your child's hand or keep them close** by, to stop this happening.

## **Tooth decay**

Sadly there are many children in school who have tooth decay, which can be very painful and lead to losing teeth and causing other infections in the body. The biggest way of helping your child avoid tooth decay, is by **reducing how often** in the day children have sugary drinks, foods and sweets. For this reason, we **do not allow children to be given sweets on the school site**. Thank you for your support with this

# **Staff changes**

### Returning to school/nursery after Easter

We expect school to be open as 'normal' in the summer term. **Main school** and **Seedling** and **Sapling classes** (Nursery) return on **Monday 12<sup>th</sup> April**. **Conkers** return a day later on **Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> April**. We will continue to operate the staggered start and pick up times during the summer term, in line with our risk assessment, to reduce the risk of spreading covid19.

**Y1**: 8.50am – 2.55pm **Y2**: 9.10am – 3.15pm

It is very important that your child arrives at the correct time, unless they have siblings, (if more than 1 child in the family, come at the later time) so they are ready to start learning promptly.

#### Dates for the summer term

Next term is usually very busy with all sorts of events. Due to the current pandemic, we have been unable to organise and plan in the usual way, but we are hoping that we will be able to share some dates/events with you, when we have a clearer idea of the national picture and what we can and can't do.
