## **Science week**









Children in all classes, carried out a number of experiments, during science week. Thank you to Miss Hillyard our Science Leader, for planning this. In **nursery**, children investigated objects, which float and sink. They also learnt about growing cress, sunflowers and beans. **Reception children** closely observed the coloured water creeping up the kitchen roll in the 'walking rainbow' experiment. They identified different colours that were created, as they mixed together They also learnt about how important it is to keep our outdoor environment tidy. They used litter pickers, to collect litter. They also found out about, the importance of recycling, rather than throwing away. **Year 1 children** learnt about lifecycles. They also designed their own lifecycle poster and carried out an experiment using skittles. **Year 2 children** enjoyed visiting our Ewe and her lambs each day, making observations and discussing how to look after them. They tested the theory that wool keeps a sheep warm and discovered that fleece was the best material.

Thank you to Mrs Hunter, who arranged for the lambs to come and stay last week. This has been 2 years in the planning, so it was great when they finally arrived. All of the children had opportunities

to get up close to the lambs and learn some key facts and we were all sad when they had to return to their farm in south Norfolk. We are however, keeping in touch with the farmer and we hear they are already enjoying being out in the fields in the spring sunshine.
