We were thrilled that 100% of families signed up to the dental screening back in April. We will be offering screening for all reception and nursery children and any children who

were absent last time, in the new year.

#### **RHE/PHSE**

In Relationships and Health Education (RHE), children in Rec, Yr1 & 2 learn about relationships, families, emotions, and looking after their physical and mental health. In Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education children learn about themselves as developing individuals and as members of society and about the feelings, views and rights of themselves and other people. We have decided to teach these subjects together, as many topics overlap or complement each other. These lessons will be called "Circle Time" from the new year.
