
West Earlham Infant and Nursery School Dental Survey – Spring 2022

108 responses




Are you happy your child is giving their teeth an extra brush in school each day? 120 responses




Would you be interested in coming into school for a short information session with the dentist, to find out more ways to protect your child's teeth/ask any questions you may have?
