If you are worried about a child and have already shared your concerns but you remain concerned, call it in again.


If you believe a child is at immediate risk of danger or harm, call 999.


If you would ever like any advice on what to do, you are more than welcome to come and have a chat with a member of the safeguarding team at school - see poster on notice board.
