This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

## Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

The school is a member of the Norfolk Music Hub which enhances the teaching of music with specialist resources. In Key Stage 1 the children are taught by a specialist teacher once a week for one hour following the Sing Up Music scheme. Music is taught explicitly as well as cross curricular and through continuous provision. It is also embedded into classroom routines, weekly assemblies and productions for both Key Stage 1 and EYFS. Children in Reception take part in a music and movement workshop of one hour every half term.

#### Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

- We have an annual performance (singing and acting) in Reception and KS1 at Christmas.
- Children in year 2 take part in a performance (singing and acting) in the summer term.

## Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

- Reception children take part in six music and movement workshops (once per half term) provided by an external provider funded by the school.
- All children in the school (Nursery through to Year 2) watch a Christmas pantomime performed in school and funded by the school.

## In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

- We are looking at how we can provide more extra-curricular music activities e.g. after school choir. There would potentially be a small charge to parents of £1 per session for their child to take part.
- We are planning to introduce music performance assemblies and invite parents to attend.
